Dear Parent/Carer,

We are delighted that your child has secured a place at Cathedral Academy from September 2020, and look forward to welcoming them into our school community.

It is an exciting time to join the academy. We are top of the school league tables in Wakefield and the surrounding area, with our results placing us in the top 10% of schools in the country for the last three years. We have a focus on every student's holistic development, with more opportunities and support available to our students next year than we have ever had before. We are extremely proud that this was recognised by the Times Education Supplement who, in 2019, acknowledged us as their 'Secondary School of the Year'.
