<p>Jesus was Divine (God) and performed many miracles showing his omnipotence and benevolence. Christians believe miracles are acts of God.</p> <p>Miracles are defined as extraordinary events that break the laws of science and the only possible explanation is God. Many Christians believe God still performs miracles today, as a sign he is still here. This might be a sign to guide people or a prayer answered.</p> <p>Jesus' miracles included healing the sick and blind, forgiving sins and rising from the dead. These all prove Jesus was the Son of God. Miracles showed the compassion Jesus had for people. He did not want to see them suffering unnecessarily. For example, when he healed a leper. Miracles provided examples for people to follow– to love and care for those who suffer. This can be seen when Jesus healed the paralysed man because of the faith of his friends. This teaches Christians to have faith.</p>	<p>Jesus lived and suffered like any other human being. This is important to Christians because they believe Jesus is with them in their pain and suffering and understands this. Christians believe God the Son became incarnated so he could save humanity from sin.</p> <p>Jesus' death meant sins were now forgiven by God and Jesus' resurrection (rising from dead) meant death was conquered . This means after death people can go to heaven to be with God.</p> <p>The Creed summarises key beliefs about God the Son: "He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. "</p> <p>Christians believe Jesus returned to Heaven and sent the Holy Spirit to earth so humans can still feel God's presence.</p>	<p>Moral evil = suffering caused by humans Natural evil = suffering caused by nature</p> <p>The inconsistent triad claims that an omnipotent and benevolent God can not exist as suffering exists. This is why many atheists don't believe in the existence of God as they argue a loving God would not allow his creation to suffer.</p> <p>Christians still believe in God but accept suffering as a part of life.
