| Christianity- a religion based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ Christ -a title given to Jesus meaning 'anointed/chosen one' Christian – a person who has received Christian baptism/ is a believer in Christianity/ follower of Christ Bible – the Christian scriptures, consisting of the Old and New Testament Sin- an act against God. Christians believe it is sin that separates humanity from God Forgiveness of sin- Christians believe Jesus died on the cross to forgive human sin The first time anyone was called a Christian is recorded in the Bible. <i>"It was at Antioch that the believers were first called Christians"</i>. (Acts 11:26). | | Belief- an acceptance that something exists or is true, especially one without proof. To have trust, faith, or confidence in (someone or something) Affirmation- statement of the existence of truth Monotheism- belief in the existence of one God The cross- is the main Christian symbol expressing the belief that Jesus died and resurrected (rose from the dead) Prophet- is someone chosen by God to speak on behalf of God or someone who is divinely inspired to reveal the will of God Revelation- a way God reveals the 'truth' to humanity | |

| Omnipotent- God is all-powerful Omniscient- God is all-seeing and all-knowing Benevolent- God is loving and kind. Sanctity of Life- the belief we are made in the image of God so all humans are precious and should be treated with and respected as part of God's creation. "So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them". Genesis 1:27 Agape- Christian selfless love The Good Samaritan – reveals the Greatest Commandment to love God and love one another | | Gospels- the first four books of the New Testament describing the life and teachings of Jesus God the Son- Jesus Christ is God incarnate (God in human form) who was fully God and fully human. Omnipotence- Jesus performed miracles and rose from the dead proving he truly was God Omniscience- Jesus knew God's plan was for him to die on the cross for human sin Benevolence – Jesus taught and revealed God's love to humanity. The greatest act of love was through Jesus dying on the cross to forgive human sin | |

| Holy Trinity- belief in one God in three persons. The three persons are equal and a unity- God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit Image: The Father of the Father of the Father of the Father of the Son and God the Holy Spirit (GOD of the Father of the Holy Spirit) The Holy Trinity is revealed in the Bible and taught by the Church. It is through the Trinity that people can understand God's nature. All three persons of the Trinity were present at creation and at Jesus' baptism. | | The Apostle's Creed- is a Christian statement of beliefs about God's nature. The Creed supports the belief that God is a Trinity who is benevolent, omniscient and omnipotent. God the Father- 'creator of heaven and earth' God the Son- 'was crucified, died and was buried' God the Holy Spirit- 'I believe in the Holy Sprit' | |
