<ul> <li>Christianity- a religion based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ</li> <li>Christ -a title given to Jesus meaning 'anointed/chosen one'</li> <li>Christian – a person who has received Christian baptism/ is a believer in Christianity/ follower of Christ</li> <li>Bible – the Christian scriptures, consisting of the Old and New Testament</li> <li>Sin- an act against God. Christians believe it is sin that separates humanity from God</li> <li>Forgiveness of sin- Christians believe Jesus died on the cross to forgive human sin</li> <li>The first time anyone was called a Christian is recorded in the Bible. <i>"It was at Antioch that the believers were first called Christians"</i>. (Acts 11:26).</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Belief- an acceptance that something exists or is true, especially one without proof. To have trust, faith, or confidence in (someone or something)</li> <li>Affirmation- statement of the existence of truth</li> <li>Monotheism- belief in the existence of one God</li> <li>The cross- is the main Christian symbol expressing the belief that Jesus died and resurrected (rose from the dead)</li> <li>Prophet- is someone chosen by God to speak on behalf of God or someone who is divinely inspired to reveal the will of God</li> <li>Revelation- a way God reveals the 'truth' to humanity</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Omnipotent- God is all-powerful</li> <li>Omniscient- God is all-seeing and all-knowing</li> <li>Benevolent- God is loving and kind.</li> <li>Sanctity of Life- the belief we are made in the image of God so all humans are precious and should be treated with and respected as part of God's creation.</li> <li>"So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them". Genesis 1:27</li> <li>Agape- Christian selfless love</li> <li>The Good Samaritan – reveals the Greatest Commandment to love God and love one another</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Gospels- the first four books of the New Testament describing the life and teachings of Jesus</li> <li>God the Son- Jesus Christ is God incarnate (God in human form) who was fully God and fully human.</li> <li>Omnipotence- Jesus performed miracles and rose from the dead proving he truly was God</li> <li>Omniscience- Jesus knew God's plan was for him to die on the cross for human sin</li> <li>Benevolence – Jesus taught and revealed God's love to humanity. The greatest act of love was through Jesus dying on the cross to forgive human sin</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Holy Trinity- belief in one God in three persons. The three persons are equal and a unity- God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit</li> <li>Image: The Father of the Father of the Father of the Son and God the Holy Spirit of the Father of the Son and God the Holy Spirit</li> <li>The Holy Trinity is revealed in the Bible and taught by the Church. It is through the Trinity that people can understand God's nature.</li> <li>All three persons of the Trinity were present at creation and at Jesus' baptism.</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>The Apostle's Creed- is a Christian statement of beliefs about God's nature.</li> <li>The Creed supports the belief that God is a Trinity who is benevolent, omniscient and omnipotent.</li> <li>God the Father- 'creator of heaven and earth'</li> <li>God the Son- 'was crucified, died and was buried'</li> <li>God the Holy Spirit- 'I believe in the Holy Sprit'</li> </ul>
